## Featured Adoptable Cat: Dudley

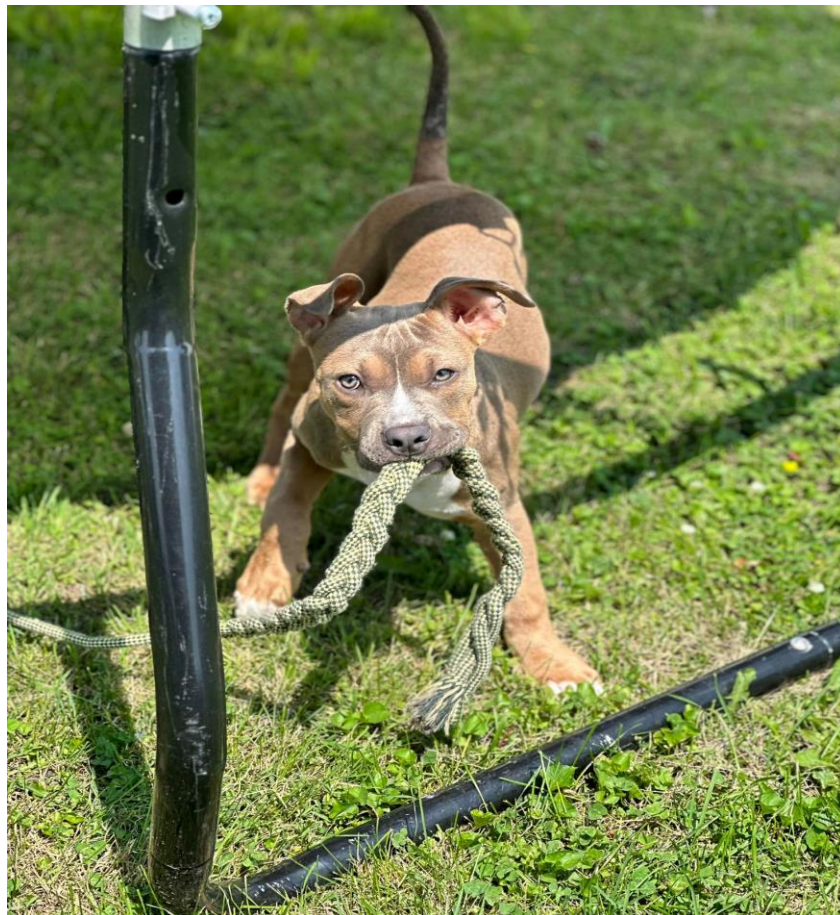
Age – Almost 8 years old

# Autumn Safety Tips

## **ANTIFREEZE**

Antifreeze poisoning is a common cause of pet death during the autumn and winter months. It has a sweet taste that appeals to pets, but even small amounts can be deadly. Symptoms of antifreeze poisoning include vomiting, lack of coordination, lethargy, and seizures. Left untreated, antifreeze poisoning can lead to kidney failure and death.

Remember to keep antifreeze stored in secure containers that pets can't get into to protect your pet. If you suspect your pet has ingested antifreeze, contact your veterinarian immediately for treatment advice.

## **RODENT POISON**

If you live in an area prone to rodents, it pays to be cautious and keep your pet away from rodent poison. Rodent poison contains dangerous chemicals like Warfarin or Bromethalin. Pets who ingest these poisons can suffer serious internal bleeding leading to vomiting, lethargy, and ultimately death.

If you suspect your pet has ingested rodent bait, contact a veterinarian immediately for treatment advice.

## **POISONOUS MUSHROOMS**

Mushrooms are another autumn hazard that can be deadly to pets. Even though many mushrooms are non-toxic, and some are even supportive of health, some varieties contain toxins that are harmful to animals.

## **One Last Pet Care Tip**

Remember that the days are shorter now, which means there's less light to see where you're going when walking your four-legged friend.
